work culture, academic standards and effective implementation of the Mid-Day Meal (MDM) Scheme. The inspection teams conducted comprehensive surprise

inspections of government schools across district Rajouri on December 18. December 18.

As per inspection reports, 14 schools were found providing substandard Mid-Day Meals not in conformity with the approved menu, raising serious concerns over students' nutritional well-being. In 10 schools, discrepancies were detected between

actual student attendance and the data uploaded on the ARMs portal. portal. The inspections further revealed misutilization of School Infrastructure

of School Infrastructure Fund (SIF) in 13 schools, while 9 schools had improperly utilized Samagra Shiksha grants. In another 9 schools, items shown as purchased were not physically available during inspection. Additionally, 15 schools failed to maintain mandatory store stock registers, indicating serious financial and registers, indicating serious financial and administrative lapses.
