According to the NIA investigations, Naseer had knowingly harboured Umar-un-Nabi by providing limi logistical support. He is also accused of destruction of evidence related to the terrorist attack, the agency stated earlier on December 9. The NIA has already arrested nine people, including three more doctors Dr Muzammil Ganaic, Dr Adeel Rather, Dr Shaheen Sayeed and religious preacher Maulvi Irian-Two others, Amir Rashid religious preacher Maulvi Irfan.Two others, Amir Rashid Ali, and Jasir Bilal Wani alias Danish, have also been arrested. On December 18, NIA arrested the ninth accused in the case, Yasir Ahmad Dar, a Jammu and Kashmir resident and allegedly a close associate of Umar-un-Nabi An active participant in the conspiracy, Dar had allegedly taken an oath to carry out self-sacrificial operations, the agency said.Umar-un-Nabi was driving the explosive-laden i20 car that detonated outside the Red Fort on November 10.

Gandhi alleged that the VB-G RAM G Bill turns a demand-driven scheme into a rationed programme controlled centrally from Delhi and strips rural workers of genuine leverage.

#### Over 17,000 street vendors benefit under PM SVANidhi in J&K; Rs48 cr disbursed

PM SVANidhi in Je.K; Rs.48 cr disbursed a total of 17,315 street vendors in Jammu and Kashmir are registered as beneficiaries under this scheme. The data further reveals that loans amounting to 750.83 crore have been approved in favour of these vendors. So far, 748.18 crore has already been disbursed, which depicts a high disbursal rate in the Union Territory. The Ministry said, "Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) play a key role in identifying eligible street vendors through surveys conducted under the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vendors), Act, 2014, or through verification of applications submitted on the PM SVANidhi portal."

After the verification is completed, eligible vendors are provided with Certificates of Vending, identity cards or Letters of Recommendation (Loß). Then their loan applications are sent to banks and other lending institutions for approval and disbursement. Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) also facilitate vendors through handholding, mobilising applicants and coordinating with banks to ensure loans are released promptly. For effective implementation of the scheme, the Union

Government asked the State and UT administrations including Jammu and Kashmir, to regularly monitor be performance of ULBs and lending institutions Pertinently, SVANidhi was introduced to offer affordable working capital loans to street vendors affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, to help them restart their businesses and pave a way for self-sufficiency

During the September 2020 Morseon Session, Parliament met on both Saturdays and Sundays to make up for lost time due to the COVID-19 pandemica rare instance of routine weekend sittings. Additionally, in 1977 and 1991, the Rajox Sabha holds, sessions to decide on the extension of President's Rule in certain states while Lok Sabha was dissolved.
