as per the said definition, a migrant was some-one who was forced out of the Kashmir Valley after 1989. This factual aspect is not disputed by appellants herein. Thus, there is no cloud or doubt with regard to the migrant status that was granted to the spondents herein.

DB further observed that one question of public

important that arises before this Court is whether a women who has been given a migrant status on account of the suffering endured by her and her family on account of which they were forced to leave their home and hearth in the Kashmir Valley on account of disturbance that was rampant in the year 1989 onwards, could be discriminated and would stand to lose the said status only on account of fact that she had got married to a non-migrant? Holding thus would be going against the nature of human beings. Respondents herein, who are ladies and on account of no fault of theirs, had to leave their place of original residence in Kashmir Valley cannot be expected to remain unmarried only to secure a job in the Kashmir Valley as a migrant. It is also reasonable to presume that because of the exodus, not every migrant woman would be in a position to find a match who himself was a migrant. In such a situation, to hold that the woman would lose her status as a migrant only because she, out of the natural urge of forming a family, had to marry a non-migrant on account of existing circumstances, would be grossly discrimi-natory and militates against the very concept of justice. This discrimination becomes even more brazen where a male migrant continues to remain a migrant notwithstanding the fact that he has married a non-migrant. Such a situation has arisen only on account of patriarchy that prevails in the human race. However, in matters relating to employment under the State/UT, such discrimination cannot be countenanced. As regards, the contention put forth by learned counsel for the appellant that there was non-disclosure/concealment of the fact that the respondents were married, is of no conseque Undisputedly, the Advertisement notice does not provide for cancellation of the candidature on account of non-disclosure or improper disclosure of facts/marital status. Further, the appellants have not been able to show how material injustice has been taken place to those who could not get cted otherwise on account of such nor sure. Therefore, this argument is also rejected, DB

DB observed that in view of what has been argued and considered and held hereinabove by this court writ petition fails and is, accordingly dismissed. The appointment orders shall be given by the authority concerned to the respondents herein within a period of four weeks.

It was further given out that under phase first a total of 501 KKGs had been established across dif-ferent districts of the UT and 1499 are going to be made functional in phase 2. It was added that for each of the KKGs a science graduate is selected by the district administration as Kisan Udhvamis for running these centres here.

-2 mtr(6.5 ft). The height of building was fixed as 10 mtr from the front road level. The owner accordingly paid residential building fee Rs 15707.

As per approved site plan, the owner towards front side was to construct kitchen left side ,porch right side, followed by living room, drawing room then back of them two bed rooms with common toi-let along with stairs inside as witnessed in duplex residential house with main entry from porch area. Besides as per drawing, the owner was to construct open Verandah on both floors. On first and 2nd floor, the owner was allowed verandah on porch area and rest of construction altogether same as in

acase of ground floor.

The owner deviating from approved site plan raised commercial construction without maintaining setbacks and didn't construction proper kiltchen, living room, drawing room and infact raised commercial halls without any internal parti-tion walls. However it deserves mentioning here that the owner initially to hoodwink general public kept window for kitchen on ground floor and main entry from porch area and raised stairs quite back of porch to reach first and 2nd floors and didn't construct duplex house by not constructing stairs alongside living room to reach first and 2nd floors and kept stairs from backside towards back of porch area . The owner actually constructed com-mercial hall measuring nearly 1400 sqft against permitted 1056 sqft covering construction area of kitchen by removing exiting window and kept pro-vision for fitting of Iron shutter measuring 10x10 ft and divided porch area into a shop measuring 10x10 and separate entry on ground floor to reach at first and 2nd floor as there was no indication of residential construction in absence of living room, drawing room, bed room except toilet on ground floor, first and 2nd floor covering open Verandah area on porch area and infect raised altogether three commercial halls against residential approved site plan. The owner didn't observe mandatory set backs as owner left 6 ft from front side when he was supposed to leave 13 ft besides extending 3 ft gal leries on three floors. The owner also raised extra construction of room on 2nd floor other than mumty. The owner has already completed plaster work on three floors.

work on three floors.

JMC surprisingly instead of taking befitting action after land use change construction reached public domain through print media by serving owner notices under BOCA Act 1988 or JMC Act 2000 by serving owner notices under provision of 253(1) and 258 (1) of JMC Act 2000 and the building should have been sealed but nothing was done by JMC and three floor commercial construction is still intact due to no action by concerned enforcement staff deployed in Ward -50 particularly Enforcement officer Anil Kashyap and Enforcement Inspector Varun Kesar properly and suitably patted by Dy Commissioner South Lal Chand which is evident from the non-stop commercial construction on residential plot despite bring ing the same into kind notice of concerned JMC offi cials. Housing Board should also take serious cog nizance of this violated construction as ongoing construction on ground floor is sheer breach of Lease deed agreement. Commissioner JMC should pay instant heed to ongoing unauthorized construc tions and ask enforcement staff to perform their duty honestly and sincerely failing which it would be extremely difficult to implement JMP-2032 in let-ter and spirit.
