

Police Station Bishnah of Subdivision RS Pura, Jammu arrested one drug peddler & recovered 14 grams of heroine (Chitta) like substance

In a relentless pursuit against drug peddlers, Jammu Police, under the operation "Sanjeevani," made a breakthrough on 19-11-2024, by apprehending one motorcyclist Akram Khan S/O Makhan R/O Chak Murar Bishnah & recovered 14 grams of heroin like substance from his possession. The diligent efforts of the police team of Police Station Bishnah led by SHO Police Station Bishnah culminated in the arrest of the accused persons at Deoli Bishnah. The recovery was made under the supervision of SDPO RS Pura and SP Headquarters Jammu. In this connection a case FIR No. 195/2024 U/S 8/21/22 of NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Bishnah, marking



a step towards curbing the drug trade in the area. Further investigation of the case is going on. Jammu Police urges all citizens to remain vigilant against the scourge of

drugs and encourages them to report any suspicious activities promptly. The confidentiality of informants will be strictly maintained, ensuring their safety and security.

DC Reasi Reviews Security at Key Infrastructure Projects, emphasises Worker Safety is priority

Deputy Commissioner, Reasi, Vishesh Mahajan chaired a meeting to review security at key infrastructure projects in Reasi District. SSP Reasi, Paramvir Singh was also present during the meeting. DC Reasi emphasised that worker safety is the top priority of District administration and instructed executing agencies to ensure proper record-keeping and strict adherence to security

Anantnag Police Arrest Two Notorious Drug Peddlers, Seize Significant Quantities of Illicit Drugs

In a major success against the menace of drug trafficking, Anantnag Police conducted two separate naka operations, resulting in the arrest of two notorious drug peddlers and the seizure of substantial quantities of illicit drugs. In the first operation, a Police team from Police Station Srigruwara set up a naka near the ATM crossing in Sallar. During the operation, they intercepted a suspicious individual identified as Fared Ahmad Shah, son of Dilawar Shah, a resident of Sheikhpora, Sallar. Upon noticing the Police, the suspect attempted to flee but was swiftly apprehended by the alert personnel. A search of the nylon bag he was carrying led to the recovery of 3.25 kg of illicit cannabis powder. The accused was arrested, and the contraband was seized on the spot. In the second operation, a Police team from Police Station Ashmuqam conducted a naka at Peer Mohalla, Ashmuqam. They intercepted a suspect, Mehrad Din Sheikh, son of Gh. Rasool, a resident of Sheikh Mohalla, Ashmuqam. Upon questioning and subsequent search, around 5.700 kg of cannabis husk was recovered from his possession. The accused was promptly arrested, and the contraband seized. Cases under relevant sections of the law have been registered at Police Station Srigruwara and Police Station Ashmuqam, and further investigations are underway. Anantnag Police remain committed to intensifying efforts against drug trafficking to safeguard the health and well-being of the community.
