Socio-Political Activist, Senior Trade Union Leader, and civic reformer Mohammad reformer Mohammad Altaf Dar has expressed deep concern over the growing crisis of educated unemployment in Jammu & Kashmir, calling it a "silent emergency" that threatens the social and economic stability of the region.

M Altafdar Rajbagh said that every year thousands of well-educated youth complete their degrees

with great expectations, technology, renewable yet struggle to secure energy, hospitality dignified employment. Poor career market." qualifications, but the job market demands practical skills, industry exposure, professional competence areas where our current system falls short." Dar stated.
