Indian Army Conducts Medical Patrol for Gujjar and Bakarwals at Rajouri

The Indian Army extended healthcare services to the remote parts of Rajouri district through a mobile medical patrol in the village of Gol. The mobile medical patrol, equipped with essential medical suppiles and services, provided compassionate health-care to local villagers as well as Gujjar and Bakkarwals. The primary objective was to offer on-the-spot medical care and backurs. Including hasic check-ups, including basic health evaluations, treat-ment of common ailments, and distribution of neces-sary medicines.
