

DDC Reasi assesses implementation of Healthcare Schemes, programs

Stressed on TB Mukh Reasi, reviews achievement under NTCP, NTEP, RBSK

District Development Commissioner Reasi Vishesh Mahajan today reviewed implementation of NTCP, NTEP, RBSK, besides general healthcare scenario in the District. At the outset, Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Ravinder, welcomed the attendees and provided an overview of the achievements recorded under different schemes/programs in the district. District TB Officer for Reasi / Udhampur, Shweta Raina, Divisional Co-ordinator, Directorate of Health Services gave a detailed presentation on the NTEP program, complete with a PowerPoint presentation and discussion of key performance

indicators. Later, DNO RBSK/School Health also gave a presentation on RBSK. The meeting discussed various issues, including the need for presumptive TB testing, increasing TB notifications through more tests, enhancing diagnostic testing capabilities in Reasi district by engaging new True-NAT Mobile Medical Unit, 100% screening of IPD, RTI must be conducted and placing a strong emphasis on drug susceptibility testing for all TB patients. Additionally, bi-directional screening of patients with HIV, diabetes, tobacco use, smoking history, as well as individuals visiting counseling centers for de-addiction and workers in hotels, restau-

gets under RBSK & rationalization of staff with special focus on block Mahore. Besides, he stressed on screening adolescent girls/boys/PW in line with the Anemia Mukh Bharat campaign and holding of special camps in far flung areas. Furthermore, the chair also directed to cover the left out beneficiaries under PMJAY/SEHAT scheme & directed to devise a plan for the same. The meeting decided to hold Special camps at DDC Office/SDM office Katra, Mahore, Dharnari & Tehsil office Pouni to benefit people. The meeting further underscored the crucial role of the Social Welfare Department in the health sector, emphasizing broadening the provision of nutrition support to pregnant women. The healthcare scenario in Doda district was today reviewed by Director Health Services Jammu Dr Rakesh Magotra here at a meeting of Health department officers. At the outset, Chief Medical Officer Dr Om Kumar gave a detailed presentation regarding the activities of the health department. The Director Health Services reviewed all the activities of the health department and enjoined upon the staff to work cordially in

making all GOI schemes successful on the ground, so that better and accessible health care facilities were provided to the people at their door steps. Discussions were also held on vaccination given to the Pregnant Women, newly born children in the District. The Director asked to ensure that each pregnant woman and newborn be given all the necessary vaccination and services at the time of birth on priority basis. Regarding the increase in institutional deliveries at block level, the Director asked the BMOs to put in their best to utilize the services of ASHAs to motivate the pregnant ladies to go for institutional & safe delivery. Emphasis was also laid on immunization, antenatal check up and wide

awareness about family planning methods. The participants were also directed to hold regular awareness camps at panchayat levels to educate the masses regarding various health sector schemes. The blocks with low performances were directed to review their work done and overcome shortfalls for proper implementation of centrally sponsored schemes. Moreover, the DHS Jammu directed the Chief Medical Officer and BMOs to put in extra efforts to achieve targets laid down under each programme. The DHS urged upon health functionaries to come up to the expectations of the patients and focus on quality, assured, accessible, affordable health care in the district. Further, he said that punctuality of staff as well as maintaining hygienic conditions in health facilities is indispensable and lackadaisical approach in this regard will not be tolerated. Deputy Commissioner reviews MGNREGA, other RDD Works in Doda District

Deputy Commissioner Doda Harvinder Singh, who is also District Programme Coordinator for MGNREGA, chaired a meeting to review the physical progress achieved under 2023-2024 plan. The ACD presented a comprehensive report detailing all ongoing and completed works, while DC stressed the importance of timely disbursement of wages to job cardholders, emphasizing that all pending payments should be cleared within the stipulated time frame. DC Singh issued clear

instructions to the Village Level Workers (VLWs) operating in Bhaderwah not to take up any work without the permission from the Chairman of BOKA. Additionally, the DC directed the VLWs to ensure that all Panchayats maintain cleanliness and hygiene. The meeting also reviewed the status of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) cases and discussed the Geo-tagging of houses under the scheme. During the meeting, it was noted that approximately 91,000 job cards had been issued, with around 87,000 job card holders actively working. The

total number of works completed under MGNREGA in the year 2023-2024 was reported as 5,740, against a total of 20,869 works started during the same period. DC Singh instructed the ACD to organize gram sabhas to review the status of job cardholders, ensuring that the names of those who had not shown demand were deleted after proper verification. The meeting concluded with a thorough review of the financial and physical progress across various works under RDD. The DC underlined the need for a proper assessment of material procurement to avoid delays. He also urged Block Development Officers (BDOs) to accelerate the execution of works and emphasized the importance of Aadhaar card seeding in resolving PMAY scheme cases. The meeting was attended by several key officials, including ADDC Pran Singh, ACD Manoj Kumar, ACP Doda, District Program Officer for the Poshan project, S. Parmjeet Singh, BDOs from various blocks, VLWs, GRSS, technical assistants, and representatives from relevant departments.
