involved terrorists and offered a reward of over Rs 20 lakh for such an information, they said.Written in Urdu, the posters sought the help of the people in tracing the

terrorists, saying "those who killed the innocents do not have a place in our country".On April 23, police announced a bounty of Rs 20 lakh for information leading to the neutralisation of terrorists involved in the Pahalgam

attack.

Massive exercise underway to clear border villages of unexploded shells

25 Professor, over 150 Assistant **Professor posts vacant at GMC Srinagar**

GY CORRESPONDENT SRINAGAR, MAY 13 The Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar is facing a severe faculty shortage, with over 150 assistant professor posts and 25 professor-level positions currently vacant.

positions currently vacant.
This information was revealed through a Right to Information (RTI) query obtained by RTI activist MM Shuja and accessed by the news agency.
According to the RTI details, GMC Srinagar has 108 sanctioned

professor posts –83 filled and 25 vacant. The vacant professor posts are due to the promotion process, which recommends eligible candidates as they meet

candidates as they meet the requirements. To address the staffing shortage, GMC Srinagar advertised for assistant, associate, and professor posts across six sub-specialities at the Pediatric Hospital on an academic arrangement academic arrangement basis under S.O. 364 of 2020, with the selection process ongoing.
