## India's 'Lakshman Rekha' against terror drawn: PM Modi

Any future attack on our soil would be retaliated on India's terms and conditions; Visits Adampur airbase, salutes courage, dedication of armed forces

ADAMPUR (PUNJAB), MAY 13

Reaffirming India's unwavering resolve to fight terrorism, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday issued a strong warning to Pakistan and terror outfits, asserting that any future attacks on Indian soil would be met with a befitting response—on India's own terms and conditions.

While addressing armed forces personnel at Adampur Airbase in Punjab, which Pakistan had claimed was damaged during the recent attacks, PM Modi, according to the news agency said, "India's new doctrine is clear: any terror attack will evoke a decisive response. India's Lakshman Rekha against terror is drawn. If crossed



the response will be powerful, precise, and on our terms."

"If Pakistan dares to carry out another terror attack, our armed forces will respond by hitting them within their dens," said the Prime Minister, while addressing armed forces personnel at Adampur

Airbase in Punjab.

"We have suspended Operation Sindoor, not called it off. New India wants peace, but it cannot tolerate attacks on humanity," he said. Highlighting the success of "Operation Sindoor," PM Modi said the Indian

forces not only defended critical airbases but also took the battle deep into enemy territory. "Our Air Force entered deep inside Pakistan in just 20 to 25 minutes and destroyed terror hideouts with such precision that the adversary couldn't even react," he said.

"More than 100 terrorists were killed, and nine major terror centers were destroyed. The Indian forces taught a stern lesson to the Pakistan Army. Our soldiers proved that India will enter the homes of terrorists and eliminate them," he declared, evoking thunderous applause from the troops. Saluting the courage and dedication of the Army, Air Force, Navy, BSF, and other security agencies, PM Modi, as per KNO, said, "Every Indian is proud of you. When the feet of our veer jवान्स touch the earth, the land becomes blessed. I have come here for your dashan. You are the inspiration for generations to come." "It is because of your valour that the entire world

## Three local LeT terrorists killed in Shopian encounter

Officials say slain involved in multiple terror attacks; arms, ammunition recovered

Three local terrorists affiliated with Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) were killed in an encounter with security forces in the Shukro Kella area of south Kashmir's Shopian district, officials confirmed on Tuesday. An official told the news agency, that a joint team of police, Army, and CRPF launched a search operation in the forested Shukro Kella area after receiving intelligence about terrorists' presence. As forces intensified the search, terrorists fired upon them, which was retaliated, leading to the



gunfight, he said. During the encounter, three terrorists were

killed and arms and ammunition were recovered

## Speaker to set-up House Committees including 3 financial panels

The Speaker of the Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly is set to constitute different House Committees, including three crucial financial committees. Sources told news agency, the process has begun to constitute these committees in accordance with the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Jammu & Kashmir Legislative Assembly. "The Legislative Assembly secretariat has sought names of MLAs from different political parties for their inclusion

in these committees," they said, adding that representation of the parties in these committees would be proportionate to their strength in the House. As per Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in J&K Legislative Assembly, 13 House Committees have to be set-up for different functions. Sources disclosed that the Speaker would first constitute three financial panels—estimates committee, public accounts committee and committee on public undertakings. Among

## Pahalgam attack: Posters in Shopian seek information about terrorists

Posters have appeared in different parts of Shopian district announcing a reward of Rs 20 lakh for information about three terrorists involved in the Pahalgam attack that left 26 people dead, officials said on Tuesday. The posters, pasted at several places in the south Kashmir district, have photographs of the three terrorists who are believed to have carried out the April 22 attack in Baisaran meadows in the tourist resort in south Kashmir. The posters sought any information about the



involved terrorists and offered a reward of over Rs 20 lakh for such an information, they said. Written in Urdu, the posters sought the help of the people in tracing the

terrorists, saying "those who killed the innocents do not have a place in our country." On April 23, police announced a bounty of Rs 20 lakh for information leading to the neutralisation of terrorists involved in the Pahalgam attack. Security agencies had released the sketches of three men suspected to be involved in the terror attack. The men, all Pakistanis, are Asif Faqi, Suleman Shah and Abu Talha, officials said. They had code names Moosa, Yunus and Asif and were involved in terror-related incidents in Poonch.

## Massive exercise underway to clear border villages of unexploded shells

The bomb disposal squads of Army and police are undertaking a major exercise in Jammu and Kashmir's border villages to defuse the unexploded artillery and mortar shells fired by Pakistan. Chief Secretary Atal Dulloo said they are monitoring the situation and will facilitate the return of the displaced border residents after getting clearance from the security agencies and will also ensure early compensation to those whose houses were

damaged in the indiscriminate shelling on civilian areas. The officials said dozens of unexploded explosives were destroyed by the experts along the Line of Control (LoC) in Rajouri and Poonch districts and along the International Border in Jammu and Samba which witnessed intense cross-border shelling and drone attacks from May 7 to May 10. The intensity in the shelling from Pakistan intensified on May 7 after the India armed forces carried out missile strikes at nine terror

## 25 Professor, over 150 Assistant Professor posts vacant at GMC Srinagar

Several projects completed last year, more in pipeline: Officials

The Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar is facing a severe faculty shortage, with over 150 assistant professor posts and 25 professor-level positions currently vacant. This information was revealed through a Right to Information (RTI) query obtained by RTI activist MM Shuja and accessed by the news agency. According to the RTI details, GMC Srinagar has 108 sanctioned

professor posts—83 filled and 25 vacant. The vacant professor posts are due to the promotion process, which recommends eligible candidates as they meet the requirements. To address the staffing shortage, GMC Srinagar advertised for assistant, associate, and professor posts across six sub-specialties at the Pediatric Hospital on an academic/organizational basis under S.O. 364 of 2020, with the selection process ongoing. The entry-level
