In a letter addressed to the Chief Minister, the Association's National Association's National

academic exploitation mental harassment, and academic exploitation that tragically pushed Shweta to take her own life on the night of July 24.

Shweta endured two
years of sustained mental
harassment and pressure
from faculty members
Naini Jain (known as
Mahi Ma'am) and Bhagwat Singh (Bhagwat Sir), whom she directly named in her handwritten named in her handwritten studied note. The note – widely shared on social media after being discovered by fellow students – alleged that students who didn't pay bribes were deliberately

The Association also flagged gross negligence after her death. Despite her roommate alerting authorities at around 11 pm., no college official, warden, or medical personnel responded. Students were forced to carry her body down six floors themselves. Her room remained unsecured for hours, potentially compromising

unsecured for hours, potentially compromising key evidence. The FIR, according to Khuehami, was filed only three days later — after student protests and her parents' arrival. Shockingly, the FIR allegedly omitted the full names and designations of the accused, which the Association believes was Association believes was

Calling Shweats' case symptomatic of systemic issues in private dental colleges, the Association said such institutions often trap students in cycles of exploitation, especially those unwilling to pay bribes. It noted that many students from Jammu and Kashmir studying in Rajasthan now fear speaking out, afraid they too could face similar abuse.

HC upheld PSA of two OGW

The Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court while deciding two different petitions seeking quashment of detention under Public Safety Act, dismissed the petition and upheld the FSA of two over ground

Justice Sanjay Dhar while dismissing the petition filed by Ameer Hamza Shah challenged detention order N0.18/DMB/PSA of 2024 dated 11.09.2024, issued by DistrictMagistrate, Eandipora, observed that obstrict Magistrate, while formulating the grounds of detention, has furnished sufficient particulars about the alleged fresh activities of Court cannot form a basis

the petitioner in which he has indulged after his release from detention in the year 2021. Thus, it cannot be stated the grounds of detention do not disclose any fresh activities involving the petitioner which are prejudicial to the maintenance of public

petitioner which are prejudicial to the maintenance of public order.
Court further observed that in any case, after the release of the petitioner from preventive detention, he has again indulged in the activities which are prejudicial to the maintenance of public order. Reference to these activities has been made hereinbefore.

for quashing the impugned detention order passed by the detaining authority. Justice Sanjay Dhar while dismissing the petition flied by Mufasil Ahmad Thoker, observed that it is clear that there are specific allegations in the grounds of detention that the petitioner has induleed in activities. the petitioner indulged in activities indulged in activities prejudicial to the security of the State even after his of the State even after his release from preventive custody in October, 2021. The contention of the petitioner that after his release no fresh activity prejudicial to the security of the State is attributed to him in the grounds of detention is contrary to the factual position. The same, therefore, deserves to be rejected.

Through his letter, he expressed deep condolences on the tragic and shocking death of Shri Sahll Sharma on July condolences on the fragic and shocking death of Shri Sahil Sharma on July 26, 2025, caused by the banned Chinese gattu dor (glass-coated kite string), and demanded justice, support for the bereaved family, and strictest action

family, and strictest action against the guilty. In the letter, Mahant Ji mentioned that 35-year-old Sahil Sharma, resident of Machine Domana, Jammu, was riding a scooter with his wife for Raksha Bandhan shopping when suddenly, near the Muthi Flyover (Ialab Tillo area), a sharp gattu dor got entangled around his neck. Due to excessive bleeding, he

died on the spot. This incident is deeply tragic and alarming for society. Through his letter, Mahant Rohit Shastri made the following four

major demands:

1. The wife of Shri Sahil
Sharma should be given a
government job
immediately so she can raise their two young daughters with dignity.

2. The family should be provided with adequate financial assistance promptly to help them cope with this painful period and face future uncertainties.

3. The strictest possible action should be taken arginet these involved in

against those involved in the manufacturing, storage, sale, and use of storage, sale, and use of gattu dor. Files should be registered immediately, and the culprits punished severely to prevent recurrence of such incidents.

4. A special long-term welfare scheme should be devised for the two daughters of late Sahil Sharma.

services. Mahant Ji emphasized in his letter that this incident is not just a personal loss but a wake-up call for society at large. Despite repeated administrative bans, this deadly thread continues to be openly available in markets and through online platforms.
